

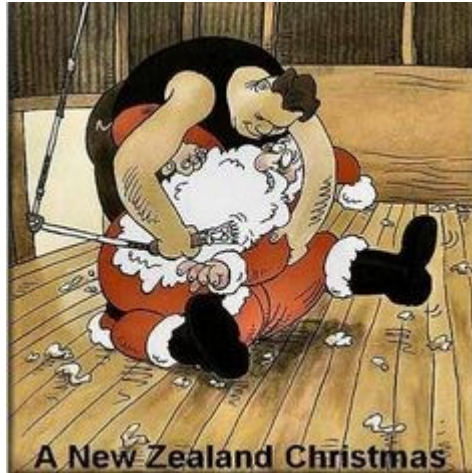
NJ 58 I am the light of the world
