

From Last Weeks Vestry Meeting

Our immediate focus will be on Advent and Christmas and the future directions meeting for Parish Consultation will be next year. In the meantime committee's are looking at a Parish Profile, a Maintenance Schedule and an assessment of the financial position of the Parish. The nominators are chosen from the future directions meeting which will be led by Archdeacon Michael Berry. The guidance book for the process of a new minister is available from the warden's.

The Parish AGM will be held in two parts for this year, the first part will be on Sunday 27th November (Advent Sunday) after the service.

Re: OSH, there will be an incident register for people to fill in left at the rear of the church when required. There will also be a form to list hazards in the church and hall and these will be visible for all church and hall users.

Vestry passed a motion that is needed for the new accounting system. The treasurer and the two wardens can pay accounts up to \$1,000 with two signatories, without prior approval from the vestry committee. Higher amounts need two signatories from the Treasurer and the Warden's and will need Vestry approval.
