Then there are the people who gave us a different dimension to the familiar stories around the Christmas celebrations at the 4 services over the week! All the organists, presiders and liturgical ministers, welcomers and sides-people...all helping locals and visitors feel at home and nourished.

Peter Eynon died just before Christmas after a long period of decline. His memorial service was held at Saint Jude's Church Avondale (where he worshipped after leaving Thames) on January 5.
