Our History

The Thames Parish was established in 1868 with the original church being opened on 5th May. However, due to the opening of the Thames Goldfield in 1867, it was soon clear that a larger building was required. The new church was started in 1871 and opened for worship on January 28th, 1872. In 1889 the cottage next to the church was bought, extended and became the vicarage.

In 1963, a new vicarage was built across the road at 603 Mackay Street, the hall was turned around to be parallel to the church and the old vicarage was joined onto the front of the Hall to provide an office, meeting rooms, kitchen and cloakrooms.

Twenty years later, the vicarage across the road was sold and another one bought in Mount Pleasant, a much more pleasant environment to bring up children.

This home has since been sold. 1984 saw the Nave sanctuary created which brought the clergy and the congregation closer together.

The focus for the next decade was the restoration of the Hall, including repiling, restoring windows and painting


